TVs, computer monitors, parts \$296.65 Million


The category of TVs and computer monitors – largely reception apparatus – declined 54 percent but Pharr remained the second-ranked U.S. port in the category.

\$250.86 Million


Pharr pork exports increased 15.01 percent in 2020 while overall U.S. pork exports to Mexico fell 5.36 percent.

\$209.17 Million


Despite a 12.59 percent decline, Pharr gained market share in U.S. electric ignition equipment exports, from 10 to 11 percent.



Electric motor, generator parts

Pharr led the nation in electric motor and generator parts, increasing market share from 11 percent to 13 percent.




Pharr ranked third nationally in the TVs and monitor category, which consisted largely of color TVs.

\$1.43 Billion


Pharr accounted for 49.97 percent of all avocado imports in 2020, its highest percentage ever.

Strawberry, raspberry and other berry imports increased 5.07 percent, in line with the U.S. increase of 5.57 percent.



Peppers, asparagus, squash, etc.

\$428.02 Million

Pharr ranked third in the category that includes peppers, which increased 14.35 percent, twice the national average.



Imports fell in 2020, ending a run of eight consecutive record years.
